## **Subculture Audit**

This audit tool provides a detailed, data-driven approach to help all teams understand their current dynamics, identify areas for growth, and develop actionable plans for enhancing collaboration, communication, and overall effectiveness. By using this tool regularly, all teams can strengthen their alignment, boost efficiency, and better contribute to the organization's strategic goals.

The subculture audit is intended to help teams identify why these elements are important to them, how they look in practice, and what outcomes they would expect when these elements are effectively functioning within their team.

If a team is not comfortable being honest and transparent when completing this audit, allow members to respond anonymously using technological resources, such as artificial intelligence (AI) or external auditors, to conduct both the quantitative and qualitative assessments. The less comfortable team members are, the less trust they have in the safety of the subculture, which will result in team members being less open and honest with one another and with the team leader (if one exists). To maximize the effectiveness of this audit, provide teams with evidence-based strategies to enhance collaboration, trust, communication, and overall effectiveness.

## Part 1: Quantitative Assessment

Each team member individually rates each statement on a scale of 1 to 5 (1 = Strongly disagree, 5 = Strongly agree). After collecting individual scores, calculate the average score for each statement and total the scores for each section. Use the rating interpretation to identify areas for improvement.
